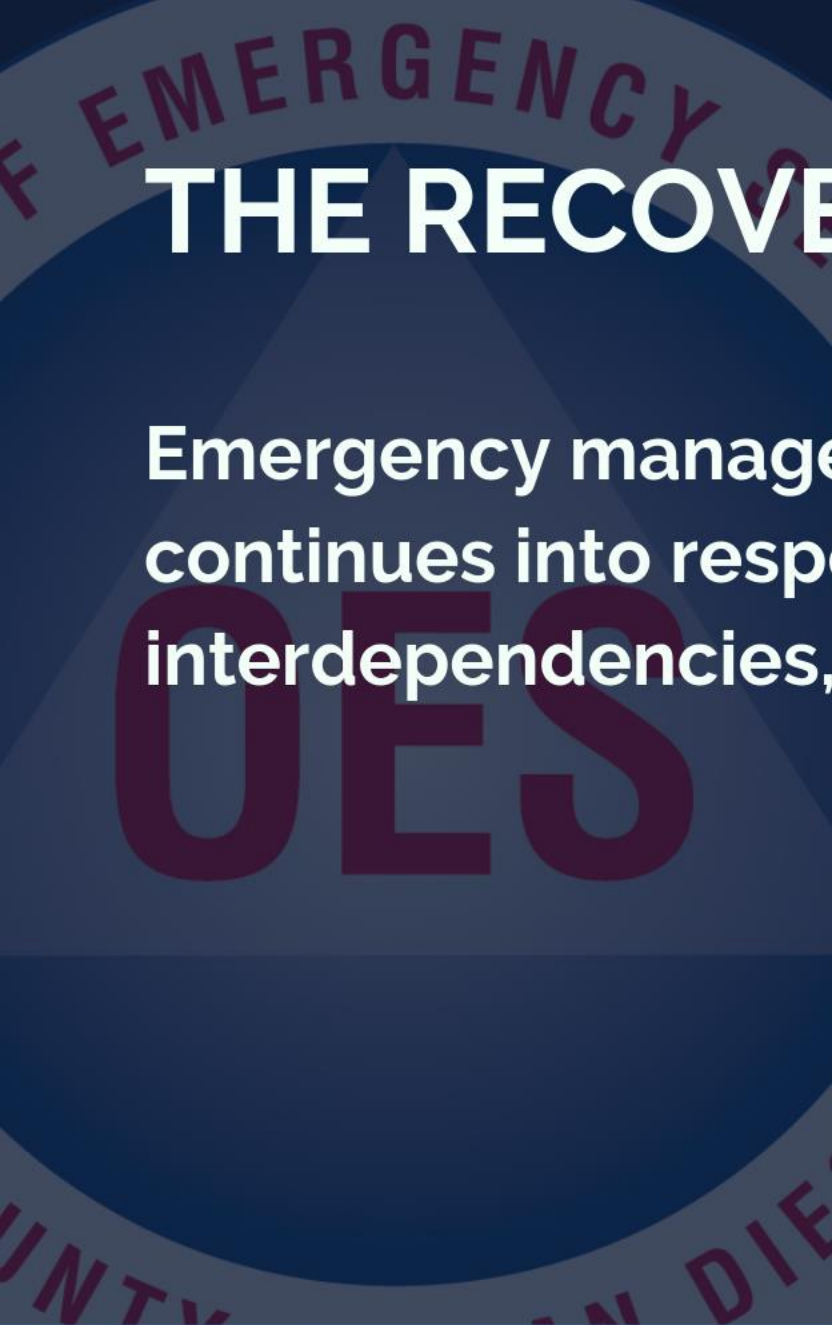

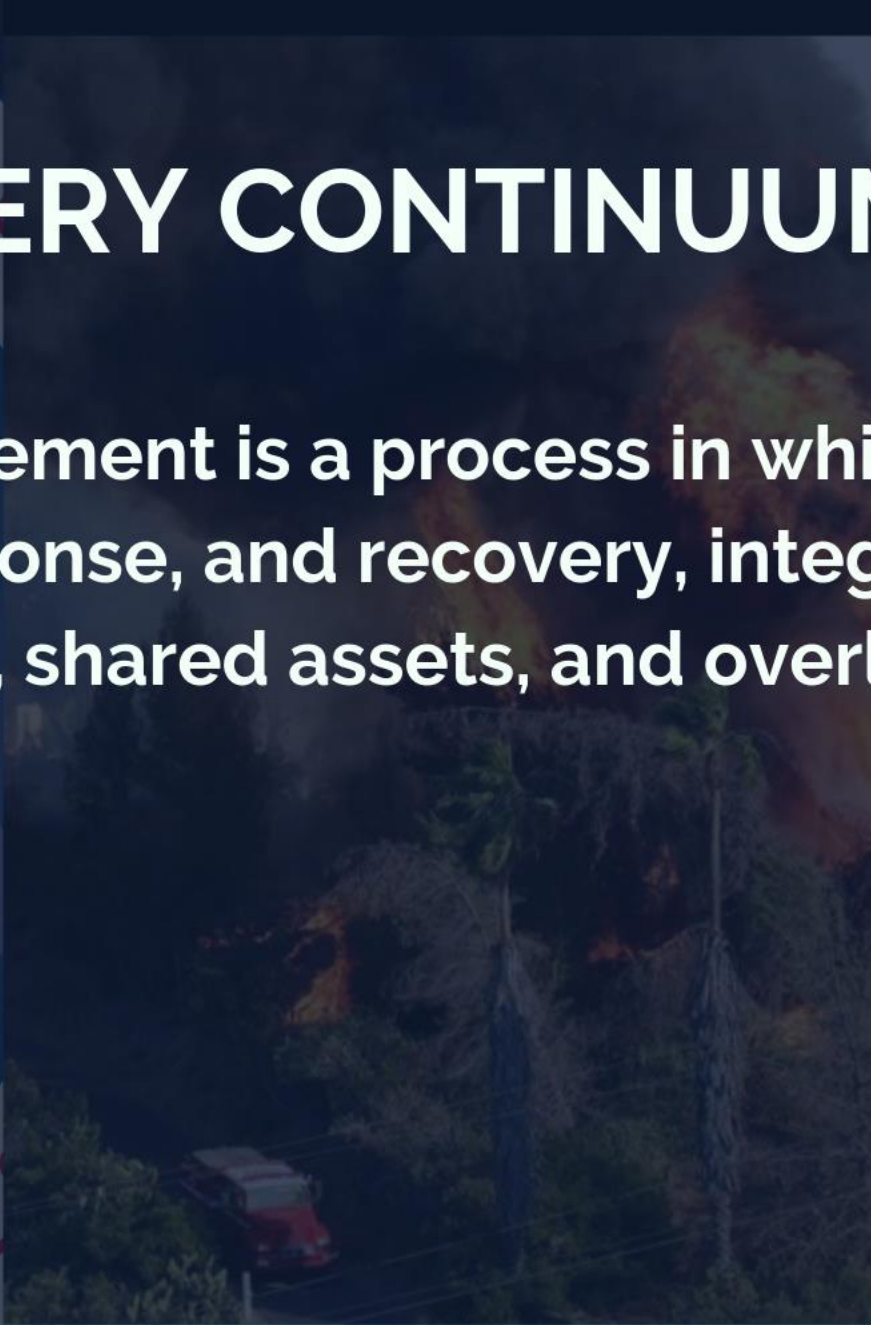

INCREASED CATASTROPHE

2018

- Natural disasters worldwide \$160 billion
- \$20 billion more than the 30 year average
- In the U.S., 14 events had losses >\$1 billion resulting in 247 fatalities
- 8.7 million acres burned in the U.S.
- 2 million acres more than the 10 year average

In California:

- 10 of the top 20 most destructive wildfires occurred in the last decade
- Camp Fire: \$16.5 billion, 86 fatalities, 18,500 buildings destroyed
- Mendocino Complex Fire: 459,123 acres burned
- Wildfire costs: \$24 billion – a new U.S. record
